Left HMS Worcester 1940 having been awarded the King's Gold Medal.

Appointed to HMS King George V as Midshipman;

1941 HMS Impulsive involved in Atlantic and Arctic Convoys; the hunt for and dispatch of 'Bismark'.

1942 HMS Onslow, as Navigator. Atlantic and Arctic Convoys. 31 December 1942; The Battle of Barents Sea (Captain R Sherbrooke awarded the VC)

Malta Convoys; D Day Landings.

1943 HMS Vigilant; more Atlantic & Arctic Convoys: out to the East, took part in the last destroyer action of the war. T/S Lt.

1944 T/Lt.

1945 Mentioned in Despatches

14th May 1945 Detached with HM Destroyers SAUMAREZ, VERULAM, VENUS and VIRAGO to search for enemy craft north of Sumatra (Operation MITRE).

15th Engaged Japanese cruiser HAGURO and destroyer KAMIKAZE. (Note: During a brilliant tactical night torpedo attack HAGURO sunk in Malacca Straits SW of Penang)

Left RN and after a brief interlude joined Shaw Savill and Albion Lines.

Appointed Master, supervised building and commanded the Southern Cross (1955) and Northern Star (1962).

Appointed Marine Superintendent.

Member of the British Council of Shipping, Chairman of the Navigation Panel.

Member and Master of the Honourable Company of Master Mariners
