CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The Membership:

Over the last twelve months we have lost nearly fifty members, partially as a result of increasing our annual subscription. We will remember those who crossed the Bar at the start of our AGM.

We currently have 121 members. Over the last year, we have welcomed only one new member and I do, again, remind all to remember the need for recruiting. We are the last remaining Flotilla and we need to keep our numbers up to survive. We have advertised in the Globe and Laurel as well as applying to do so on the FAAOA website and hope this will bring in some recently retired new members.

The Committee:

A great deal of behind the scenes work is done by your Committee, without whom the Flotilla could not function. I am most appreciative of all their individual efforts and, also, for the contribution they make to the general running of the Flotilla.
